HOMEWORK AT OAKLEIGH STATE SCHOOL

Homework is a valued component of the Oakleigh learning experience. Homework at Oakleigh serves to:

- Establish positive home routines for future learning
- Develop independence in organisational skills
- Share information about a child's learning
- Reinforce class learning.

Homework should be a positive activity that reinforces links between home and school. It should not be a stressful or time-consuming task. Any concerns about homework should be discussed by parents, teachers and students in order to facilitate the best outcomes for students.

Consistency of practice

To ensure consistency of practice, each year level will:

- have an agreed approach to homework that is standard across the grade
- set regular homework that provides flexibility for families
- design homework tasks that align with the expected time allocation for the grade level

School expectations

Homework routines and procedures will be explicitly shared with students. The school expectation is that teachers will:

- set homework regularly and provide clear explanations of all tasks
- differentiate homework to respond to range of learners

- include reading and at least one additional component of literacy or numeracy
- design tasks that reinforce classroom learning
- where homework is set that requires marking, it is marked regularly and acknowledgement of student work and effort is given
- not include classroom assessment items
- provide regular communication with parents
- not include unfinished classroom tasks, unless previously negotiated with parents.
- It is requested that parents:
- provide support for students as the homework tasks are completed
- help students to manage their time effectively
- communicate any feedback about homework with teachers
- view homework regularly.

Special considerations

In special circumstances, aspects of homework can be adjusted through negotiation between students, parents and teachers
