This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of students in the Upper 2 bands in NAPLAN writing in Year 3 to 50% and Year 5 to 40%.
- Increase the percentage of students in the Upper 2 bands in NAPLAN numeracy in Year 3 to 50% and Year 5 to 40%.
- Increase in the proportion of students achieving As and Bs in English and Mathematics in all Year levels As to 22% and Bs to 41%.
- Engage in an inquiry cycle to build student well being.

Our initiatives include

- Engaging in Year level and individual teacher data conversations to analyse student learning data and plan for differentiation.
- Implementing a whole school coaching model to deepen educators' knowledge, understandings and reflective practices.
- Implementing a whole school model for enhancing the learning of advanced and gifted learners.
- Providing intensive, targeted support for students not yet at standard in English and Maths.
- Enhancing student wellbeing through engaging in a professional learning inquiry cycle.
