On these days there are some guidelines that need to be considered.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sun safe clothing. No singlet tops, sleeveless shirts, exposed midriffs, miniskirts or short shorts • Suitable footwear. No thongs or high heels. • No make-up, fingernail polish, jewellery • Appropriate messages on T-shirts. No offensive language, drawings or messages are acceptable.
